Introducing the Marlin and Doris Thomas Memory Center

Anticipation of the Groundbreaking Celebration has been heightened by additional joy, now that the Memory Center officially has a name.

It was 40 years ago that Willow Valley Communities welcomed its first Residents to Willow Valley Manor, but this story begins 40 years prior, when the Thomas family opened a stand at the Southern Farmers Market in Lancaster. The Thomas' were primary suppliers of poultry and eggs at the time, and every Sunday the Thomas' would host supper in their home for friends and members of the team. Their love for hospitality and reputation for delicious meals and baked goods soon led to the opening of the Willow Valley Motor Inn and Restaurant in 1966. "Where friends dine with friends," the slogan used to say. Over the years, the Thomas' servant leadership on missions through

their Mennonite church and outreach partnerships, brought to fruition through their organized efforts, made the Thomas name widely recognized.

Friends would come from far and wide to dine at the restaurant and those passing through town were welcome to stay in the family's home. They rejoiced in the opportunity, enjoying the fellowship of those with whom they served in the community. It was not long before regular diners and travelers began to flock from all directions and, with humor and sincerity, those who had visited loyally over the years started to suggest that they might like to retire to Willow Valley. Enamored with their passion for hospitality and providing to others a sense of 'home,' the Thomas family proudly broke ground for the first Lifecare community at Willow Valley and opened its doors at Manor in 1984.



That was a big year for the Thomas'—one that nourished the vitality of this stretch of the county, and ignited more growth and hospitality than they had ever dreamed. Four decades later, the Thomas' are demonstrating their love and servant leadership through a new endeavor that will serve as a testament to their desire to foster comfort and inspire a sense of home. With this new chapter, Willow Valley Communities and the Willow Valley Communities Charitable Foundation are humbled to announce that the seven-acre campus specifically designed to address the current and future needs of our entire community, will forevermore be known as the Marlin and Doris Thomas Memory Center.

This project is of personal interest to so many. As the indiscriminate grip of dementia touches the lives of millions, millions more are tasked with finding a better way to provide specialized care. From a vision conceived in 2016, the Marlin and Doris Thomas Memory Center has, with dedicated effort, become a beacon of hope and a model for memory care where undeniably high quality of life will transform the way dementia and aging are viewed and experienced.
